1950 Mission Street is a 36,000-square-foot undeveloped parcel between 15th and 16th Streets in the heart of the dynamic Mission district. Currently it is an empty lot that sits right next to the 16th Street BART station. The parcel was recently acquired by the City of San Francisco from the San Francisco School District. It is being fast tracked to build affordable housing.

Mission Housing and BRIDGE Housing is proud to announce its recent application to the Mayor's Office of Housing & Community Development Request for Proposal to create 165 units of 100% union-built affordable housing at 1950 Mission Street.

If awarded the project, Mission Housing and BRIDGE along with architects David Baker and Anne Cervantes, will build much-needed housing for low to moderate income residents, including housing affordable for minimum wage earners, construction workers, artists, and the formerly homeless. The project will include a state-of-the-art Head Start youth space for Mission Neighborhood Center and provide neighborhood-service retail space for local nonprofits and entrepreneurs. Other amenities include the Mission's first rooftop community gathering area and solar power.

The project is designed to serve the real world needs of the San Francisco's Mission neighborhood; affordable housing, jobs, sustainable economic development, security, education, community and culture.

The goal is to bring together all stakeholders; community groups, government, organized labor, green capital and community development professionals, affordable housing advocates, local businesses and contractors, with a win-win development strategy that creates value for all.
